
Saugus atstumas



Finding Our Names Together

Residency, Lithoania, 2023

Initially titled "Bridging Roral and Orban", this residency program operated as a platform for artists to elaborate their artistic practices through the lens of The New European Bauhaus concept, living and creating in rural and urban environments. Embracing togetherness through community arts, beauty through aesthetics of the community, and sustainability through the value chain of their final products, residents were connecting with local audiences and artists, and transforming both their individual practices, and territories in which they were working.

5 international residents have Participated: Calin George Irimia, Cristiana Fertozinhos, Gary Markle, Pritha Kondo, Zan Hoffmann. Through the stay, they have developed numerous artistic outcomes which were presented in monthly events. The pinnacle of the residency was a New Years festival with music program in the premises of 3022 which gathered around 200 visitors - Eketė / Ice-hole.

LAB 3022: critically investigating the fotores of AI

Residency, Lithoania, 2024

This residency looked into the fotore. Engaging with artist&architect Sotanoka Jasho, the residency aimed to critically investigate the hegemonic production of technological fotores, focusing on the ideas of AI-singularity and smart cities. It operated as an artistic research laboratory and employed AI itself to arrive at its results. The resident was mentored by: 1) AI developer (LTO), 2) orbanist from OIT festival (EST), and 3) interdisciplinary publishing specialist from Institute of Network Coltures (NL), hence developing both technical and conceptual expertise. The final expressions included 1) AI-based artwork, 2) workshop, 3) tech-arts pavilion at Yaga Gathering. The pavilion was co-created with a local community of creatives who built a cultural program and architectural elaboration around the artist's research, broadening the impact and situating the artist's work in a vibrant milieu.
